

Pastor Peter Writes...


Dear Advent Pilgrims,

At our recent meeting of Toronto Conference Lutheran pastors, we explored the topic of spirituality. Apparently polls and surveys reflect that a rapidly increasing number of people claim to be “spiritual”, while at the same time expressing no interest in “organized religion”. Declining membership and worship attendance statistics confirm that many Canadians are turning away from the church – or synagogue or mosque – to satisfy their spiritual needs. Yet it seems to me that so much of popular spirituality is focused not on one’s consciousness of God, but on one’s consciousness of self. In other words, it focuses inward, rather than outward – which is Martin Luther’s basic definition of sin.

It’s a complex subject, and I’m by no means an expert; but I find myself

confronted by the recurring question: Is spirituality something each person does “by myself, within myself, and for myself”? Or is spirituality a process in which the individual “I” grows in relationship with God, others and creation. I believe that Jesus’ call to take up the cross and die to self directs our spirituality beyond the limited wisdom and narrow vision of so-called “enlightened self-interest”. Jesus’ death and resurrection proclaim that spiritual fulfillment – which is God’s ultimate will for us and all human beings – is more fully realized as we become less concerned about it. “Those who lose their life will find it,” Jesus promises.

Such is the paradox of the cross, which the season of Lent invites us to trust more deeply, and which the hope of Easter sends us into the world to make visible in our deeds, to make audible in our words,



and to make desirable to our spiritually hungry neighbours, whom we are called – indeed, commanded – to love as we love our “self”.

Current, Festival and Loose Giving

Current giving corresponds with the "Current Budget" line of your offering envelopes. Festival donations are those from the pink envelopes at Easter, Christmas, etc., and loose are miscellaneous funds not specifically indicated from a specific member or envelope. Our total for these items for January-February was \$13,143.95, a significant increase of \$3,266.29. It should be noted that the 2014 amount includes a one-time donation of \$2,853.00, although even

deducting this sum, we are still ahead of 2013 by \$413.29.

Facilities

Facilities revenue for January-February was \$8,338.83, comprised of revenue from extra hours, in addition to revenue from our regular users. The revenues show an alarming decrease of \$5,486.92. Bear in mind that Facilities revenue fluctuates considerably as rental payments are received. However this is not a one-time occurrence, our property revenue has declined drastically.

Benevolence Giving

Regular Benevolence giving for January-February 2014 decreased slightly by \$114.00 from 2013. Global Hunger giving is forwarded directly to Synod, and does not affect Advent's financial position. The amounts are included for information only.

Parking Lot Fund

To the end of February, 2014, total receipts for the New Parking Lot Fund totalled \$1,272.00.

Has Christ Been Divided?

“That all of you be in agreement and that there be no divisions among you” (I Corinthians 1:10)

On a very cold, snowy and wintery night in January, a group of Christians from various denominations came together at Advent Lutheran Church for the annual Service of Prayer for Christian Unity. The service was a deeply spiritual time when differences were set aside and our common faith in one God takes precedence.

In spite of the cold, wintery night, the attendance was very good. Members of Advent made the evening a welcoming time with their many delicious goodies and their efforts in providing for our neighbours. Their hospitality was very much appreciated.

A large choir of about thirty voices uplifted us with two anthems, “Make Us A City Of Refuge” and “Talkin’ About Hope”. These two songs spoke about living with hope in the city of God where we find refuge and purpose in life.

We learned that the name “Canada” means “village” in the Iroquois language.

The best part of the evening was our speaker, The Right Reverend Mark MacDonald, National Indigenous Bishop of the Anglican Church of Canada. He had a very inspiring sermon that started with an Ojibwa greeting which means, “Greet everyone as a relative.” He told us that Native people pray in four directions. They believe the scriptures to be true, living and very active. The revelation of the word of God is our destiny and is revealed in Jesus Christ. The “Medicine Wheel”, which represents the four Gospels, provides faith in the truth, which is greater than the mind can comprehend. When we encounter the Great Spirit, our knowledge is tentative, so always be humble in the presence of God. Jesus gives us the whole image of God, and the power of the Holy Spirit to speak to people.

He also spoke about life in Alaska. Living in such a cold and challenging environment, suddenly the mystery of Christ becomes clear. In Canada people are tempted to put their trust in things,

which is a form of idolatry and is praised in our society. Facing such poverty of spirit can lead us into a deeper relationship with God and each other. I am just remembering a few of the things Bishop Mark said, and I am sure he said a lot more. I only know he was very uplifting to listen to.

In last September’s newsletter I wrote an article about the water issue among the indigenous communities in Canada. I was very happy that Bishop MacDonald’s “Water Project” was a concern for the Ministerial Association of North East Toronto, who sponsored the service and were raising money to support this project.

This Week of Prayer for Christian Unity service was the most meaningful of the many I have attended over the years. Has Christ been divided? Not at this event. We all went home uplifted, inspired and ready to do the work of Christ.

The Toronto Conference will hold its Spring Meeting on Saturday morning, May 10, at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Richmond Hill. Everyone is welcome and each congregation is entitled to two lay delegates for voting. We will elect Conference clergy to be delegates for the 2015 National Convention. There will be

no Conference Council elections due to the new structure that is expected to be in place later this summer.

You may have noticed that the Conference websites have been removed from the Synod website. The Bishop and his Assistant Rev. Riitta Hepomaki are meeting with the Toronto clergy toward the

end of April, and we look forward to a report from Pastor Lisinski following the meeting. The Bishop will be appointing "Deans" to lead each of the new Areas in the Synod. Most likely the *Lutheran Connection* will be ending and some sort of new communication structure will be developed. ♦
