Congregational Council Update

At our September Council meeting we began making plans for the rest of the year. I'll be giving you some of the information, and you will get more details in individual reports.

50th Anniversary

We need to begin making plans – we're late already – for our 50th anniversary year. Two of our Council members volunteered to work on the committee, but we need a few more people. Please let me know if you are willing to be creative and help with the plans.

Council Members

We accepted Carrol Pearson's resignation as a Council member. We now have only nine persons on Council. Council decided that we would not appoint anyone to fill the vacancies at this point, but we need to fill our vacancies and two other positions where Council members are completing their terms at our annual meeting. Both of these are eligible for re-election.

The Bishop's Visit

We are eagerly looking forward to the Bishop's visit on October 6 and hope as many members and friends of the congregation as possible will be able to join us for this special occasion. We will also be dedicating our replacement font at the service.

Musical Events

Musically a lot will happen this fall. On November 2 our congregation joins with the choirs of the other congregations who worship with us as well Trevor Hicks giving an organ recital to here the capabilities of our refurbished organ..

Trevor is also planning to present *The New World* on November 23. This is a highly ambitious undertaking on his part so we hope as many people as possible can be present to support him.

Clean Up Time

Please come and help us do some extra cleaning around the church, particularly

washing the windows, on Thursday, October 3, beginning at 10:00 a.m. This isn't just women's work – men are invited as well. We need to evict the spiders and other unnecessary items as well. This clean-up is very timely in anticipation of the Bishop's visit.

Outdoor Maintenance

The foundation planting around the church is in serious need of attention. The weeds have taken over and many of our shrubs are being strangled by weedy vines. You may remember that at the time all of this planting was installed, Advent agreed to maintain the foundation planting. This seems to have been forgotten. Somebody Else isn't around anymore. If you can give a few hours, please bring your tools and energy and help us clean up the area. The soil is difficult clay to work in (as very little if any good topsoil was installed) so the tools need to be quite strong. In some areas it's like chiselling concrete. Deadwood can be cut from the shrubbery, but it is too late in the season to do any serious pruning. Most of that will have to wait until spring. Weeds are the major problem and they can be eliminated, but it may take a couple years before they all get the message. If we can't maintain this area, we may need to consider replanting grass.

Bob Schickedanz and I met with the coordinator of the community garden plots and reviewed areas where they need attention. The coordinator is keeping detailed notes of the gardeners and how they are maintaining their plots. Any that do not meet the requirements will forfeit their plot.

Finances

On September 8 Fred Roth gave an update on our finances (the August 31 report is included on Page 5). Our giving is considerably lower than last year and we need to give serious consideration to being able to pay our bills so we do not

find ourselves in financial difficulty at year end. Please do what you can to help.

Committee Meetings

Our ESO, Worship and the Arts, and Stewardship Committees have met recently and their reports and decisions will be reported separately.

be with you all.*

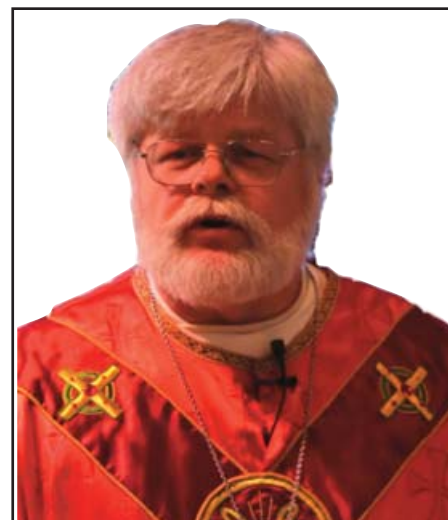
Today you and I, the people of Advent, stand together on the threshold of a most exciting year in our congregation's history. As we celebrate our forty-ninth anniversary this October, we begin our fiftieth year of ministry and mission in our Peanut Parish community. Our Council is establishing a task force to begin planning the theme and special events to be held during the twelve months ahead. We welcome your suggestions, invite your prayers, and encourage your participation.

As a prelude to this year's celebration, we have invited The Rev. Michael Pryse, Bishop of our Eastern Synod, to join us on Sunday, October 6. He will visit our English Circle prior to worship; he will preach the sermon at our 10:00 o'clock service – which will also include the

dedication of our newly furnished baptismal font – then join our customary Table Talk session before having lunch with our Council members. Please plan to be present and invite a friend or neighbour to join you.

This provided additional opportunity to interact with the people in the community garden as the participants regularly spoke to gardeners about their gardens and other things.

Feedback from students during and after the program was very positive.

Although the formal part of the program was finished, it was decided that the group would continue to meet about once a month and continue their learning and conversation on various trips such as a trip to the Toronto Music Garden, Toronto Botanical Garden, AGO and Allen's Gardens.

These trips will be advertised and are open to all, so that they will continue to serve the outreach of Advent Lutheran Church.

bus to Don Mills Station. From there you take the subway to Sheppard-Yonge. Then take the subway southbound all the way to St. Patrick.

Current giving corresponds with the “Current Budget” line of your offering envelopes. Festival donations are those from the pink envelopes at Easter, Christmas, etc., and loose are miscellaneous funds not indicated from a specific member or envelope. Our total for these items for January – August was \$42,730.62, a decrease of \$3,885.78, a somewhat disconcerting drop. Please note that offerings in our pink envelopes from Good Friday totaling \$784.25 were donated to the Oriole Food Bank, comprising part of the difference for 2013 versus 2012.

These revenues, and, in large part, the revenues from Facilities pay our every day operating costs, including Pastor’s salary and benefits, organist and music costs, and property costs such as utilities, repairs, and indoor and outdoor supplies and maintenance. At the same time, we are committing to specific capital projects such as the parking lot and organ upgrade, and other benevolence such as the Vanier and Woodbine Breakfast programs, and the National Church Praise Appeal.

When choosing the direction of our donations, we can’t lose sight of the

current, festival and loose component, as this portion “pays the bills”, while capital projects and benevolence are one time undertakings. Although important work of the church, capital projects and benevolence should be “additional” to what we direct to current, festival and loose. Continuing reduced current, festival and loose revenues could lead Advent into financial difficulty at year end.

■ **Toronto Conference Meeting – September 28.** Interested Toronto Conference clergy and laypersons met on September 28 at either Holy Cross Lutheran Church in Newmarket in the morning, or at Toronto Chinese Lutheran Church in Scarborough in the afternoon, to discuss the pros and cons of breaking the Toronto Conference into Areas. Nineteen congregations were represented. We had a lot of discussion and realized there was no real reason for breaking up. By remaining the Toronto “Area”, congregations have the flexibility to work with each other on special projects, with neighbouring Anglican and other faith groups for community activities, and as a whole for major events.

We will keep the congregations informed as more information becomes available.

New and Gently Used Sweaters Urgently Requested

CLWR has placed an urgent call to the ELCIC members to donate new and gently used sweaters for Syrian refugees facing yet another harsh winter.

Advent is partnering with Canadian Lutheran World Relief (CLWR) and other Lutheran churches across Canada to collect sweater donations nationwide.

The sweaters will be distributed to Syrian refugees living in the Za'atari refugee camp in Jordan. About 125,000 people in the camp are bracing for another cold, wet winter. Many still live in tents and lack warm clothing after

having fled their communities with little more than the clothes on their backs. The harsh weather conditions in the desolate Jordanian desert are another hardship on top of the traumas suffered through the brutal civil war.

“Every bit of warmth we can provide will make a difference,” says Robert Granke, executive director of Canadian Lutheran World Relief. The sweaters will go to the people in the camp who are in the most need.”

Men's, women's and children's sweaters of all sizes are needed.

The goal is to collect 10,000+ sweaters and dispatch them to Jordan in time for winter.

Please let me know by October 12 if you have any sweaters to donate, and we'll arrange for you to get them to the church to be packaged and forwarded.

All sweater donations need to be in transit to CLWR's Winnipeg warehouse no later than October 31. For more information, please visit www.clwr.org.
